THE PROBLEM: Political attacks on your First Amendment rights

- Citizens cannot improve county or school district policy.
- Voter information controlled by government insiders.
- Politicians call *thousands* of bills "emergencies" to stop petitions.
- Complex 1563-word procedures from 1910 are run by lawyers.

THE SOLUTION: The Petition Rights Amendment (PRA)

- Permit local petitions. Ballot titles up to 60 words must be in plain English.
- Provide facts filed by citizens for voter guide. Hold one election yearly.
- Limit state to 12 "emergencies" yearly. Fewer lawsuits, faster reviews.
- 400 simple words in law will let average citizens request a vote.

Proposed ballot title in 2026:

Shall Colorado allow petitions to all local governments; revise procedures to review petitions quicker; inform voters of petition contents; limit ballot titles to 60 words; cap how many new laws may be exempt from possible voter review; hold one election yearly for all petitions; change most petitions only by another voter-approved petition; and repeal certain petition laws?
